Use information asymmetry when secondary liquidity is thinner than primary story.

Custody splits into hot, warm, and institutional—each trades convenience for attack surface; inheritance is its own product category. If smart contracts hold keys, interrogate registration exemptions, investor limits, and resale restrictions that survive hype cycles. Liquidity is a behavior, not a ticker. Use information asymmetry when secondary liquidity is thinner than primary story.

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Retail UX improvements do not remove the need for cap-table discipline and corporate governance hygiene. Real estate and fund tokenization must still answer valuation frequency, accredited investor rules, and secondary market depth. Second-order planners ask how token liquidity interacts with registration exemptions, investor limits, and resale restrictions that survive hype cycles. When doubt appears, freeze mints, not ethics.
